Eugene Dopheide in front of 'Flying Gulls' and 'Gull Homecoming.' These photographs were taken whilst spending time at Phillip Island.





### Have you thought about Gallery Sitting?

Our volunteers play a crucial role in helping The Foundry Arts Space operate. Currently we are on the hunt for more volunteers that are interested in gallery sitting.

### What does gallery sitting involve?

Gallery sitters ensure our doors stay open by being at the gallery for a 3 hour shift: either 10am-1pm or 1pm to 4pm.

If you are on the am shift you need to pick up the key up from a nearby shop to open the doors. Whilst on your shift you are involved in welcoming visitors in the doors and using the point of sales computer for any sales.

### Why should I consider gallery sitting?

Seeing visitors interact with the artworks on display is rewarding. The gallery has heating/cooling so that the space is comfortable throughout the year.

If the gallery is quiet it can be a great space for you to work on any small artwork or craftwork and gallery visitors are encouraged to bring art/crafts that they are working on into the space.

# SAM- Shepparton Art Museum. Ellen Lee | Landscapes; of sight, of sound 21 October 2023 – 28 January 2024

Ellen Lee's solo exhibition Landscape; of sight, of sound presents a series of large-scale abstract works on paper that explore her personal, sensory experience of nature. Derived from blind contour drawings (a process of drawing without looking at the paper), her works layer gestural marks and pigment to create a mapping of the landscape. Each work is the culmination of notations from multiple excursions, offering to the audience an extended moment to pause and be present.
