This exhibition builds on the group show held at the Shepparton Art Museum(SAM) in 2023.

The SAM exhibition "After the Rain" was a response to the river and floods of 2022. Altered States will include work from the SAM exhibition and new works by members of the Tuesday Junction art group. It will reflect, in a broader sense, changes to our river and environment, beyond the impact of the floods. The exhibition will include a group installation piece using sandbags; found items that have morphed into objects both beautiful and thought provoking, textiles, printmaking, collage, mixed media, painting and sculpture.

The Tuesday Junction Group have been meeting for almost 20 years and this will be our 18th group exhibition. Our exhibitions are usually themed and often include a collaborative installation work.



Tuesday Junction's Opening Night:



region.




Rochester Mural Festival:

SAME COUNTRY, DIFFERENT INTERPRETATIONS

ELAINE VAN DYK & JUDY HUTCHINS



Coming soon to The Foundry is an exhibition by local artists: Elaine Van Dyk and Judy Hutchins. You will want to come and see how both artists explore the Australian landscape with their contrasting styles!

Tell us about your upcoming exhibition. What ideas/themes are you exploring?

The exhibition will explore the landscape through the eyes of two artists from different cultural backgrounds. Judy Hutchins was born in Australia, while Elaine vanDyk was born in South Africa. Their backgrounds and personal experiences influence how each sees and interprets the Australian landscape. The artworks are a response to the landscape, their interpretation of its moods, tones, colours, textures, the feelings evoked, the essence of the landscape. The exhibition will consist of paintings and printmaking and will take the viewer from the vast, rugged outback to mountains, tranquil waterways, and to Australia's beautiful coastal areas.

The exhibited works explore the deep connection between identity, culture, personal history, and the timelessness of the natural landscape. Capturing both the emotive infinity of Australia's vastness and the visceral textures of its immediacy, Same Country, Different Interpretations wonders, softly, whether it is we who conjure the landscape or the landscape that conjures us.

What has inspired the ideas/themes you are exploring?

Judy:

If I were to use one word to describe my work for this exhibition it would be – Evocation.

The Oxford Dictionary describes evocation as the act of bringing or recalling a feeling, memory or image to the conscious mind. To me a landscape is not just a pretty picture of a mountain, tree or river, it is a memory: an emotion.

I have a deep spiritual connection with the land. In particular the vast open country of my youth.

A lot of my work is inspired by childhood memories of the outback station my grandparents lived on. I recall the hot dry paddocks, the red earth and the big skies that went on forever. I remember the build up of clouds promising rain but only producing dust. The sense of being at one with the land. Peace. Quiet. Calm.

These emotions and memories form the basis of my artwork. I'm drawn to the colours and textures, the very essence of the landscape.

Elaine:

I am inspired by the character, or personality of each place I experience, whether that be the ruggedness, the dry fragility, the huge, apparent emptiness of a landscape, the boldness and strength of the rocks, and the rhythms in the shapes of the tree trunks, or the uprightness of them, like soldiers standing to attention. Sometimes I engage with the strength or subtlety of the colours, the ochres, pinks, reds and yellows to fuel my representation. At other times, especially in my printmaking, I prefer to work in monochrome/black and white. I love the honesty and simplicity of monochrome/black and white, and enjoy the challenge of creating strong visual effects without reliance on colours.

What materials have you been using to create the artworks you intend to exhibit?

Judy:

My work for this exhibition will consist of paintings on wooden panels using oil paint and cold wax. Some smaller works will also be included including works on paper using oil and cold wax and some using acrylic paint.

Elaine:

My work is largely 2-dimensional. I paint in either oils or acrylics on canvas. However, since these mediums feel and behave so differently from each other, my creative response to them differs accordingly, so viewers will notice my painting style between the two mediums varies.

With regards to my printmaking artworks, these are mostly on paper, but occasionally I print on fabric. These are created with either lino, woodblocks, dry point scratched plates, or etched and aquatinted copper or zinc plates. I also experiment with eco printing with leaves and other plant materials to create beautiful, natural underlays to work over.
